FROM PETERSBURG.

PETERSBURG, July 1.—After leaving Reams' station the enemy's raiders retreated to Stony creek, Fitzhugh Lee pursuing. Here the enemy made a feeble stand, but were quickly dislodged, and continued their retreat towards Jarratt's station, on the Weldon road, our cavalry still pursuing them. At this point their retreat was turned into a rout, the enemy losing their organization and scattering in every direction, the most of them, however, getting through to Grant. Two more pieces of artillery, nine wagons, including Wilson's headquarter wagon, a number of prisoners and small arms were captured.

Yesterday evening the enemy made a feeble assault on Colquitt, and a demonstration in front of Gracie, both of which were easily repulsed.

Our capture of prisoners at Reams' station foot up 357, including the wounded. The negroes reclaimed number 700.
